
Our Junior class play was entitled, "A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court." We have put on several pep assemblies during the year and sponsored a school dance.



REVIEW OF 1947 FOOTBALL SEASON

The 1947 Comet grid machine lost only one contest of an eight game schedule; scoring 251 points to 31 for the opponents.

The season opened with a 46-0 victory over the Canton C-Hawks. The Comets scored almost at will, whether traveling on the ground or through the air. It was a splendid first game showing and indicated that the Comets were headed for another successful season.

Leeds, the defending conference champion, never penetrated deeper than the Comet 45 yard line. Another assortment of good running plays and forward passes humbled the champions 40 to 0. It was the first Comet victory over the Lancers since 1943.

The game at Elk Point saw a weak Pointer eleven wilt 47-0 before the blistering attack of speed and power exhibited by the Comets. This was only the second Comet victory over a Pointer eleven since 1938.


South Sioux City boasted one of its best teams in recent years, but were unable to match the versatility of the Comets who triumphed 26-0, a fitting climax to our homecoming events.

In four games the Comets had scored 159 points while holding their opponents scoreless and they seemed ready for Vermillion in the climax contest of the season. We scored twelve first downs to six for the Tanagers but lacked the punch when the chips were down. Both teams were undefeated, and a crowd of 2,500 people saw the Comets make a game fight as they lost their only game of the season by an 18-0 score.

The Comets made it twelve in a row over a speedy Rock Rapids team that was humbled 18 to 7. Sibley, only Lakes Conference member on the Comet schedule, was another game competitor, but the Comets had too many guns and won 48-0.

The closing game of the season saw an undefeated Akron eleven completely outclassed and severely beaten 26-6 in below freezing weather, on a snow covered field. It was the tenth straight victory over the Redshirts and a glorious finale for one of the best Comet grid elevens ever to wear the Blue and White.

Five Comets were honored by being selected on the all-conference team. This quintet included Marvin Kool, end; Keith Eilers, tackle; Lloyd Schlueter, center; Carl Millikan, fullback; and Burt Britzmann, quarterback. Marvin Kool received special recognition on the associated press Second All-State Team.




The above illustration shows the 24" x 36" size DAV-SON Cork Back Bulletin Board, plain, without glass door. See price list.
