FOREWARD





May this echo of the past, reminding you of knightly deeds that have been wrought, be an inspiration to you for present endeavor and a challenge to future achievements.











1951 FOOTSALL REVIEW

The Hawarden Comets, flashing brilliance some moments and mediocrity others, finished the 1951 gridiron season with a 4 and 4 record.

In the opener against a strong Worthington, Minnesota eleven, who had one game already under their belts, the Blue and Whites trailed only 14-6 at half time, but withered in the last half before a strong Trojan attack and dropped a 26-6 verdict. The game was highlighted by a sparkling 87-yard touchdown run on a kickoff return by Chuck Swanson.

The following week the Tri-State Conference season was opened on a dull note, as the Comets traveled to Sioux City's Leeds and were again defeated. The Lancers, who were rated highly in Northwest Iowa, scored the first time they got their hands on the ball, and from there on it was a runaway. The Comets tried in the first half when they produced their only tally, but it wasn't nearly enough and they dropped their second game 47-6.

Smarting from this defeat, the Comets came back the next week to down the LeMars Bulldogs on the local gridiron 6-0 in a hard-fought affair. The Comets were knocking on the LeMars' goal all evening but couldn't muster a score. However, when only two minutes remained in the game, a blocked punt was uncovered by Jim Ney in the visitors' end zone, resulting in the only score of the evening.

On the following Friday the Blue and Whites took on the South Sioux City Cardinals in another Tri-State league contest on the local field. The Comets had the Nebraska boys on the ropes early in the game when Mick Kelley scored 50 yards on the first play of the game to put the ball deep in Cardinal territory, but a fumble erased their threat. Later in the first period a pass from Beck to Wohlenberg produced a tally, but the conversion failed as South Sioux began to recover from their early game shock, and started to roll. By half time the score was knotted 6-6, and a late game touchdown produced another defeat 12-6.


An unusually warm October afternoon touched off the festive Vermillion homecoming activities when Hawarden traveled to that South Dakota town for a league encounter. Trailing 6-0 at half time, Hawarden came back to grab a close 7-6 verdict as Mick Kelley rammed over for the touchdown and game-winning extra point. This seemed to take the starch out of the Tanagers as the Comets were threatening to score again when the ball rested on the Vermillion five-yard line at the final gun. This victory was gained at a price, for Vincent Johnson suffered a broken leg and was lost for the remainder of the season.

A band of Sioux Falls' Cathedral footballers spoiled an otherwise successful Homecoming for the Comets the next Friday when the Blue and Whites gulped a bitter 12-7 loss. Mick Kelley rammed over for the only Comet touchdown of the evening, and Keith Waterman added the extra point in the second period just before Jay Beck interrupted a Green and Gold pass and galloped 55 yards before being forced out on the Cathedral ten-yard line. The half-time gun ended their threat and the Comets could not score again.

Playing Rock Rapids in sub-freezing temperature on the following Friday, the Comets unleashed a brilliant display of passing and running as they overcame a 12-6 Lions' half-time lead to blast the Rock Rapids' eleven, 26-19. Kelley, Morgan, Waterman, and Swanson all contributed one touchdown each to a smashing Comet win in a game that was more one-sided than the score indicated. This victory clinched a third place finish in the Conference.

The following Friday was the final game for ten Hawarden seniors and the Blue and Whites grabbed a fine 26-19 win over Orange City in a game that inaugurated the "Battle for the Wooden Shoes." The Comets trailed 12-0 at first quarter, but fought back fiercely to close out the 1951 football season with their fourth victory.

Four boys were honored on the All-Conference team. They are: Adrain Kool, end; Milo Gaul, tackle; Jim Ney, guard; and Chuck Swanson, quarterback.
