On November 25, 1922, the Hawarden Comets completed a 9 game undefeated football season by downing Fonda, Iowa, 32-0. Approximately 32 years, 2 weeks, 6 days, and 5 hours later, the 1954 Comets tramped off the gridiron after accomplishing the same feat. It's been a long time; for every 1 point scored by the Comets of 1922 in their final contest, the people of Hawarden were to wait 1 year for another undefeated season.

A very well balanced Hawarden eleven took Akron's "Red Raiders" in stride in the season's opener, 34-6. Players were chosen each week by the Independent as outstanding for their work in that week's game.

For the second game in the Siouxland Conference, the Comets traveled to Canton, for an afternoon contest with Augustana. Hawarden's passing attack was the deciding factor; the final score being 25-0.

The Le Mars Bulldogs were the next to fall prey to the Comet "all-around hustle and team-play." Hawarden won this game handily, 31-7.

The team was in high spirits, and looked forward to Homecoming with keen anticipation, but this did not stop them from trouncing South Sioux City 27-6. Outstanding fullback, "Honk" Liston, contributed much to ruining South Sioux's Homecoming.

Our own Homecoming success was threatened as Vermillion surprised, and scared the Comets before bowing 13-6. The queen's escort, Jerry McGuire, monopolized Hawarden's scoring, and was named outstanding back.

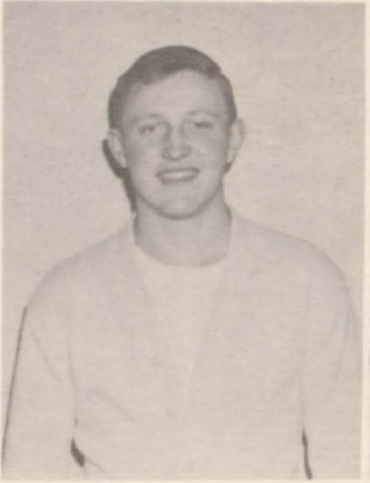
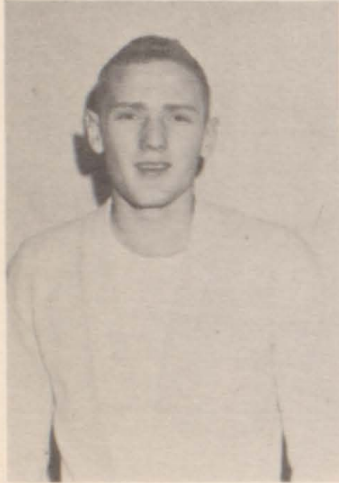
Hawarden again played the role of "party-buster" when they ruined the Homecoming of Gehlen of Le Mars, 31-7. This was our third conference victory.

In another conference game, Hawarden rocked giant-killer Rock Rapids, 19-7, who had previously defeated Orange City.

The climax of the '54 season came against arch-rival, Orange City. The Comets were in high spirits for the occasion, for the Siouxland Conference championship, and the wooden shoes trophy depended on it. Orange City boasted the state's leading ground gainer, but one man wasn't enough to stifle a well balanced football machine. Hawarden ended on the big end of a 27-13 score, and the Independent chose a "team of the week."

Elk Point proved to be the toughest foe of the season, but they also fell prey to the Comet's superior teamwork. Twelve seniors ended up their high school careers in grand fashion, 19-13.
