





Those were the happy days, carefree days, and days of drudgery, that made up our grade school and junior-high memories. Memories that set the stage for a notorious high school career.




When the curtains opened on our sophomore year, the footlights shone on Ray Gaul, ably performing the duties of president, and Mary Truesdell and Rima Rheder backing him up. The stage was set in pink and black as our "Fool's Holiday" gave the entire student body a leading role in the Sophomore Carnival. Homecoming this year was a bigger part of our lives as we drew plans and stuffed mapkins for our first entry in the long line of Homecoming floats. Lorraine Dekkers upheld the tradition of our class, serving as our sophomore Homecoming attendant.

We had now passed the amature stage, and entered our junior year as professional upperclassmen. This was without a doubt our biggest production but it was smoothly polished by our able president, Edith Burkhart, and her assistants, Ron. Thompson and Beverly Hartman. The first act highlighted our junior class play, <u>Time Out for Ginger</u>, which earned for our class, the well-deserved reputation of "free-loaders," and "party-lovers." The fun was exceeded only by the hard work, and the class play yielded bountiful laurels for the Class of '57. Carolyn Johnson took the stage as our junior Homecoming royalty, and the class was equally well-represented by our automotive entry in the Homecoming parade. The final act was the one that captured the audience, as under the able direction of Mrs. Snell, and Mr. Appell, we formed our prom--"Stairway to the Stars." After hours of incessant cutting and glittering we were well rewarded as the reluctant seniors admitted that the final product was something to be proud of--How Well We Knew That!

Now the curtain has opened on our final year. The setting is sentimentally simple, but the atmosphere rings with success. Laverle Rozell has accepted the part of our senior president, and his two understudies are Ken Bode and Anthony Louwerse. Homecoming captured a great share of the glory of this final production, as Bev Hartman regally reigned as Homecoming Queen, attended by Jeannie Dalton. Hours of pleasant labor were spent making final plans for the royal ceremony and building our senior float. Nothing was forgotten--not even the burro! Once more we were given a chance to bring our reputation into the spot-light as work began on our senior class play, <u>Catch a Star</u>. Within a year we jumped from a girl whose only desire was to play football, to a French actress whose success was "certainment." This was our year to recieve the royalties, so we sat back and relaxed as the juniors fummed and stewed, frantically attempting to produce a prom comparable to the one of the previous year.

1957 passed, slowly for some, but rapidly for the greatest share of senior actors, and toward the end of May, the faculty reluctantly closed the curtain on one of its most successful productions. Commencement was all the applause we needed, and as each senior eagerly grabbed his diploma, you could hear his faint but determined mumble, "This old place will really be dull next year!" The faculty laughed and proclaimed that every class leaves with those same words, but silently they admit the inevitable--"This sure will be a dull place next year!!!"

Although the Comets scored first on a 15-yard pass from Gaul to Janvrin, South Sioux City went on to win their homecoming, 7-6.




